Basic qualifications:

- Must be at least 18 years of age. (School-to-Apprenticeship applicants may be 17.)
- A high school diploma or GED equivalency is required. (School-to-Apprenticeship applicants must be enrolled into an accredited high school program.) Applicant must provide an official transcript(s) for high school and post high school education and training. All GED records must be submitted if applicable.
 - Applicants must submit a DD-214 to verify military training and/or experience if they are a veteran and wish to receive consideration for such training/experience.
- Be physically capable of performing the essential functions of the apprenticeship program, with or without a reasonable accommodation, and without posing a direct threat to the health and safety of the individual or others.
 - Qualified applicants may be subject to a physical examination or drug screening or both on acceptance into the program and prior to being employed.
- Must possess a valid Alaska Driver's License, and driving record must meet minimum requirements.
