Mobile Job Centers

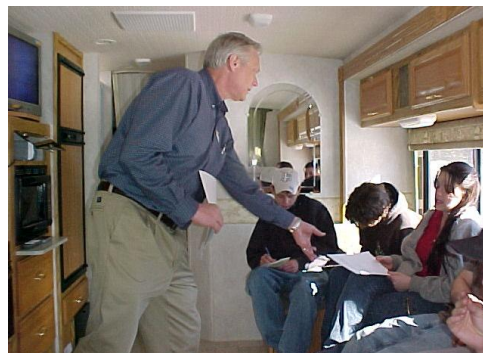
The Alaska Department of Labor and Workforce Development Mobile Job Centers are designed to be mini “Job Centers on wheels”. These vans take the department’s Employment and Training Specialists to job seekers and employers on their own turf, whether it’s in rural areas, where they simply don’t have Job Centers. They can also go to Alaska’s schools, job fairs and areas facing big employee layoffs.



The 32-foot converted motor home in Anchorage has “Mobile Job Center,” and the Department of Labor’s logo printed on both sides and the back, so it’s hard to miss. The Mobile Job Center based out of Anchorage has four laptop computers that plug into the Internet via cell phone links (Cellular One and ACS), plus a printer, TV, DVD and VCR player and extra battery power.



A similar, but smaller version bears the same markings. This version is a 22-foot converted cargo van that allows people to stand up inside. It is outfitted with two regular desktop computers that plug into the Internet via cell phone links (Cellular One and ACS), plus a printer, TV, DVD and VCR player and extra battery power. This version is designed to travel to cities and villages on the Alaska Marine Highway System.



The Mobile Job Centers are staffed and operated by local Alaska Job Center team members.
